A Year in Review

The Legislature began its 2020 session by introducing almost 2,400 policy proposals, of which 20% impacted early learning, K-12 education and higher education. By March 2020, the CASBO Legislative Committee reviewed and took positions on 30 proposals that ranged from special education to school safety and workers' compensation.

On March 13, 2020, Governor Newsom announced a shelter-in-place order in response to the pandemic caused by the 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19). The Legislature made numerous procedural changes to continue operating and consolidated their process to focus solely on COVID-19 related policies.

As everyone adjusted to the constant changes resulting from the COVID-19 crisis, CASBO worked diligently on AB 1384 by Assemblymember Patrick O'Donnell (AD-70, Long Beach) to provide temporary and limited liability protections to LEAs that comply with all state and local health requirements and guidance. However, the bill was not granted a policy hearing and, therefore, is not reflected in the Legislative Scorecard.

As we enter a new legislative session, it is even more important for CASBO members to continue actively participating in the legislative and regulatory process in Sacramento.

Description of Scored Legislation

CASBO Supported

AB 1837 (Smith): School Safety: Emergency Response Team. This bill would have required the Superintendent of Public Instruction, subject to an appropriation, to establish an emergency response team in CDE to serve as a liaison and provide guidance and support to school districts, county offices of education and charter schools. The bill would have required the emergency response team to guide the process for, and facilitate expedited processing of, requests for allowance of attendance due to specified emergency conditions, and to coordinate with the California Department of Public Health and other federal, state and local agencies. AB 1837 stalled in the Senate and did not make it to the Governor's desk; therefore, it is not reflected on the Senate scorecard.

SB 884 (Dodd): Education Finance: Emergencies: Public Safety Power Shutoffs. This bill would have added public safety power shutoffs to the list of emergencies for which an LEA can receive the total average daily attendance that would have been credited to the LEA had the emergency not occurred. SB 884 stalled in the Assembly and did not make it to the Governor's desk; therefore, it is not reflected on the Assembly scorecard.

CASBO Opposed

AB 1835 (Weber): Local Control Funding Formula: Supplemental & Concentration Grants. This bill would have required LEAs to identify unspent Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) supplemental and concentration grant funds and annually report to CDE its estimated and actual spending of those funds and include this added information in its Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). The bill would have specified that unspent supplemental and concentration grant funds shall continue to be required to be expended to increase and improve services for unduplicated students. AB 1835 was vetoed by the Governor.

Description of Scored Legislation

SB 1159 (Hill): Workers' Compensation: COVID-19: Critical Workers. This bill defines “injury” for an employee to include illness or death resulting from COVID-19, under specified circumstances, until January 1, 2023. The bill creates a disputable presumption that the injury arose out of and in the course of employment and is compensable for specified dates of injury. The bill limits the applicability of the presumption under certain circumstances. The bill requires an employee to exhaust their paid sick leave benefits and meet specified certification requirements before receiving any temporary disability benefits or, for police officers, firefighters and other specified employees, a leave of absence. The bill also makes a claim relating to a COVID-19 illness presumptively compensable after 30 days or 45 days, rather than 90 days. SB 1159 was signed into law by the Governor.

Scorecard Methodology

The Legislative Scorecard demonstrates the final floor votes cast by legislators in top proposals that CASBO actively worked on, either in support or opposition.

Yes votes are represented with the letter “Y” and **No** votes are represented with the letter “N.” For legislators who decided to **abstain** on a bill, their action is marked with the letter “A.”

In instances when a legislator was not in office during the time of the vote, the vote count will be marked with the symbol “—.”

For a legislator to score **100%** in alignment with CASBO’s policy positions, they would have to vote in **support** of **AB 1837** or **SB 884** and in **opposition** to **AB 1835** and **SB 1159**.
